ARTIST STATEMENT

I've been painting for 30 years. It's my passion. It gives me life and energy. The main idea behind my work is an impulse to create a burst of emotion that makes you go further, that makes you want to conquer the world. Vivid colors best express this. I paint large because it gives me room to breathe. I hate constraint. I value freedom and I want to express it through my art. I see larger than life and that's what I paint.

I describe my work as *new expressionism*. My style is a fusion of brilliant colors, explosive gesture and figurative details with a contemporary resonance and appeal. My paintings are loaded with raw energy. They reflect intense emotions of love, passion, death.

Music provides a bubble in which I isolate myself from the world in the creative process.

The subject matter that interests me is the human body. I have no shame about it. It's an object of beauty and an endless source of inspiration. I try to depict the body of men and women liberated from the censorship of puritanical attitudes.

New York City is raw, off limits. Within a few miles, you have access to the whole world. That's why I choose to live and paint here. I get restless elsewhere. The city's rhythm pulsates in my canvases.

Life is full of contradictions. I express these emotions with the contrasts and dichotomies I portray in any given painting. I bring it all together but there is never a resolution. It always remains a process, just like modern life. We live in a world of paradoxes and I'm always on the edge.

I have always believed that I have something to say and to bring to the world through my art. Nothing can stop me from saying it and following my vision, my dream. My gestural strokes reflect my unapologetic attitude - my drive for success, my restless dedication. I can't imagine not painting. It's my destiny.

Armed with her BA in Fine Art from the University of Quebec in Montreal, Corno quickly turned to a full time painting career. Her first representation was at the *Clarence Gagnon Gallery* in Montreal. By the late 1980s, she had become the darling of Montreal collectors and one of the most sought-after Quebec artists. Her reputation was quickly growing across Canada with shows in Toronto, Ottawa, Calgary and Vancouver. She was the featured artist at the *Quebec Pavilion* at *Expo 86* in Vancouver which propelled her visibility to new heights. During this period and into the early 90s, she was represented by *Yves Laroche Gallery*.

With a strong market in Canada, Corno turned to the US and had shows at the *Morgan Gallery* in Boston and *San Diego State University*. But New York City was an irresistible magnet, so she moved there in 1992. To jump start her career, she participated in group shows and various art events. Following in the footsteps of O'Keefe and Dali, she was the featured artist at *Steuben Glass* which placed her paintings in their flagship store on Madison Avenue.

The new millennium brought Corno to *Opera Gallery* in *Soho* which began representing her work worldwide. In a few years, she became their best-selling contemporary artist. Her work is now on permanent display in all of their locations: *New York, Paris, London, Monaco, Singapore, Hong Kong, Seoul,* and *Dubai,* not to mention *Los Angeles* and *Miami.*

Playing a balancing act of high energy dichotomies that stimulate the imagination and throw the viewer off balance, her *new expressionist* style superimposes itself over underlying intricate figurative details. The resulting fusion has a contemporary resonance and appeal. A superb colorist, she incorporates intense textures into her surfaces and uses bold brush strokes.

The year 2010 had several landmarks for Corno. First an important exhibition titled In the Mood for Art took place at Opera Gallery Hong-Kong. Next, Corno unveiled part of the Marilyn Monroe Collection which she had undertaken the previous year. Then she participated in the SIDIM (Montreal International Design Show) where her art work raised the most funds to benefit hurricane survivors in Haiti. Corno also immortalized rock star bad boy, Eric Lapointe by painting his portrait for the cover of his hit CD album. Two charming television interviews stand out: Bénezra Recoit and Des Kiwis et des hommes. But the biggest surprise of all was the launch at AKA Gallery of Cornographie, Corno's autobiographical account of her beginnings in New York City published by La Presse Editions. Her anecdotes are whimsical and her style as colorful as her art. The year ended with an Opening at AKA Gallery and a onewoman show at Opera Gallery New York simply titled Corno that was by all accounts a smash hit.

In 2009, Corno had an important exhibition at *Opera Gallery Singapore* titled *Corno & Ali Esmaeilipour* followed by her first major exhibition at *Opera Gallery Dubai*, a joint exhibition with Wang Yehan. Another major event – she was the *Guest Artist* of the *Montreal International Jazz Festival* for the celebration of their 30th anniversary which coincided with the 30-year mark of her own artistic career. The commissioned painting is on permanent display at the *TD Gallery Lounge*. An Opening at *AKA Gallery* scheduled to coincide with this event made the evening news on CBC television.

The *Thompson-Landry Gallery* in Toronto featured Corno's work in a special anniversary celebration of their own gallery. An exhibition at *Opera Gallery London* took place in the fall and showcased several large murals. The year ended with the late Fall Opening at *AKA Gallery* which featured a selection of works rich in earth tones which marked a departure for Corno from her usually bright palette. The event made headlines once again and was mentioned on CTV's *eTalk* which airs nationally.

These exhibitions followed on the heels of several landmarks in 2008. First, Corno had a major exhibition at *Opera Gallery Hong Kong*. Next, it was *Opera Gallery Paris* that was at the forefront with the exhibition, *Corno & Moz*. Later in the year, a group show *MADE IN NY* juxtaposed her bold paintings and those of others artists with the American masters who influenced her figurative work. The frantic pace didn't let up and this exhibit was followed by an Opening at *AKA Gallery* in Montreal and another joint exhibition titled *Roc-Roussey & Corno* at *Opera Gallery NYC*.

This international rise to fame took place in several stages. In 2007, Corno was the *Guest of Honour* for the *Fido Spot* where her work was projected on the largest state of the art outdoor digital projector system in Canada. Before that, her work was featured at *Luminato*, Toronto's *Festival of Arts and Creativity*, in addition to being shown at the *Thompson Landry Gallery*.

In 2006, AKA Gallery in Montreal which exclusively represents Corno opened its doors. The event did not go unnoticed and was featured on prime time national news. At the beginning of the year, Corno had been the featured artist at the Premiere of the Cirque du Soleil's Alegria at the prestigious Royal Albert Hall in London. Her works were also on exhibit in the swank Roof Gardens. In tandem with this event, Corno's art was featured at Opera Gallery London. The year was rounded off with exhibitions at the Left Coast Gallery in Los Angeles, and a sold-out two-woman exhibit at Opera Gallery Hong Kong.

2005 highlights include an interview for the documentary *The Art of the Nude* directed by Bernar Hébert which premiered at the *International Festival of Films on Art*, and later aired on *Bravo!*, *Art-TV, France 5* and *CBC Television*. Before that, it was the *Massive Media Techno-Graffiti Event* at the upscale *Columbus Circle* and *Union Square* in New York City where Corno's art was projected on building façades in bold high-tech fashion. Earlier in the year, she was Guest Artist at the high-brow international event *The Train Paris New York* creating a 45 foot mural for fashionistas, curators, designers, diplomats and celebrities.

Corno's works can be found in museums, and corporate and private collections all over the world. In 2009, MORE MAGAZINE named her one of the Top 40 over 40 Women in Canada. Later in the year, Chatelaine Magazine included her in their list of the Top 100 Women in Quebec. After much hard work, she never takes her success for granted and encourages young artists to follow their dreams because sometimes... dreams really do come true.

OP CORNO CANADIAN ARTIST CORNO CREATES SENSUAL POP ART WITH A PULSE YOU CAN DANCE TO.

ull of vivacious color, ecstatic motion and sensual, muscular lines, the figures in the large-scale canvases by Canadian painter Corno seem to swirl in an orgy of motion. Her bodacious paintings are celebrations of form, figure and the rush of enjoyment. "You've got to turn yourself on. If you're not turned on by what you're doing, there's no point," she says from her studio in SoHo, the historical heart of New York City's modern art district, where she has lived since 1992, Clearly, painting turns Corno on and her paintings turn on many collectors. In fact, her work is so popular that all of her canvases are pre-sold. Represented internationally by Opera Gallery and in Canada by AKA, she's exhibited everywhere from Miami and Los Angeles to London and Hong Kong, and her paintings graced the London premiere of Citque du Soleil's Alegria show.

Born Joanne Corno in Chicoutimi, Quebec, in 1952, Corno was a small-town girl with big ambitions. She moved to Montreal at the age of 17 and traded her dream of being a ballerina to study art education at the Université du Québec à Montréal. It didn't take long for her to realize that her burning desire was to paint, not teach. Informed by her love of dance and its muscular physicality, her four ongoing series — titled "Faces. Women, Men and Portraits" — found an immediate audience with Montreal's movers and shakers. "It's Pop Art with emotion," she explains. Certainly, the paintings in her Faces series owe much to Andy Warhol's screen-printed pop portraits of his adored icons. However, the people behind the visages in Corno's series remain anonymous even as they are immortalized. Where Warhol's work was about modernist identity and fame, Corno's pieces illustrate an instantaneous and transitory celebrity.

The fleshy weight of the figures in Corno's paintings have also incited comparisons to British painter Lucian Freud — grandson of Sigmund Freud. Yet Corno maintains her own work is more modern. "I have a very classical way of drawing. I just push it further." While Freud's paintings evoke mortality, Corno's erotically charged images are seductive celebrations of life. As such, the deathly serious might condemn Corno's work as simply decorative, and it is — both simple and decorative. But to dismiss simplicity is to forget that Picasso labored intensely over his most seemingly simple line drawings: Creating an impression of ease and fluidity is a hard-won illusion. "Sometimes people look and see only three lines, but sometimes it took me 30 years to get to those three lines. It's so hard to be simple and strong — to have all the information but be very basic."

Judging by how quickly Corno's Hong Kong exhibition sold out, her exuberant brushstrokes may soon reach an even wider audience. After all, sometimes a bit of light can remind us that life isn't so deadly serious after all. CornoStudio.com




The Montreal Review: I see power in your paintings. "Power" was my first thought when I saw one of your canvases. Can we say that the power in your art, the power in the faces and the bodies of all these women and men comes from passion? Do you seal the human passion in your paintings?

Corno: Power always comes from passion. But I don't consciously try to infuse my work with it. I've always had that burst of energy and passion, and I guess I've translated it into my paintings. It's very instinctive, actually. It's not an effort.

Q. It is strange and sad that art was for

centuries a male domain. Do you think that humanity lost irrevocably half of its creative genius because female sensitivity and ability for artistic expression had been oppressed and excluded for so long?

A. Female sensitivity was always expressed in art, but in a different way. On the

business side, of course, it's not easy to be a woman artist in a man's world. For instance, last year I went to a contemporary art auction at Sotheby's where only one female artist was represented. It may be harder to break through, but I firmly believe that to be an artist is not a choice, it's a vocation. I don't think it has anything to do with gender.

Q. What is Montreal for you? You studied Fine Art at the University of Quebec in Montreal. Your first representation was at the Clarence Gagnon Gallery in Montreal. You are permanently represented at AKA Gallery in Montreal's Golden Mile.

A. Montreal is where I was born, and where I started my research. I've always loved this city, but at a certain point the market became too small for the scale I wanted to work on. Everything I did was too crazy, too big, and too expensive. I kept wanting more. I wanted international representation, I needed to be challenged. I found no end of challenges and new opportunities in New York, but I still spend some time in Québec and find it important to stay rooted. For instance, I was just selected to be the artist of the Montreal International Jazz Festival for its 30th anniversary.

Q. What does painting mean to you – freedom, expression, meditation, communication, salvation..?

A. When you paint, you're in a zone. I always meditate before I start working: it's all about concentration. You have to let go, you have to be totally involved and focused



and aware of what's going on between you and the painting. In a sense, you become this channel of emotions, and transpose them into the canvases: starting with something that doesn't exist, plain white, and creating a character, a light, an emotion from scratch. It kind of has a spiritual aspect to it, so I try be open minded and available, not trying to control the whole thing. I just let it come to me.

Q. If I'm not wrong, Andy Warhol influenced your work. Who are the other masters that you like and from whom you learn?

A. I like artists from various periods of history. Art is like music: you don't listen to only one band. I like many painters. Off the top of my head, I'd say Renoir, Toulouse-Lautrec, Julian Schnabel. My biggest inspirations don't necessarily come from other painters, they come from all sources of art I'm confronted with every day: food, music, photography, cinema, billboards. It also comes from traveling and discovering different cultures.

Q. Tell me some of your favorite books and writers.

A. I like to read biographies, like Charlie Chaplin's, Barbara Walters', Notorious BIG's. I find them very inspiring. It's great to read stories about other people who struggled, fought and succeeded, and to discover how it all happened. Recently, I liked reading Augusten Burroughs and Deepak Chopra, and I read lots of magazines, like Andy Warhol's Interview. I'm very interested in people.

Q. You are a successful painter. You are highly esteemed among art collectors and MORE MAGAZINE listed your name among the Top 40 Women in Canada for 2009. There is always something bigger and probably more valuable behind the success - a personal story of hopes, hard work, hardships and probably moments of despair. What is your advice to the younger artists, to those who start their professional life now?

A. Follow your instinct! Believe in yourself. Always be daring.

Q. When I was a child I liked to draw, all my school notebooks were filled with small caricatures and drawings, but I never became a painter... I know that it is a risky profession to be a painter; for this job you really need to be a special sort of man. Do you remember the moment when you said: I will devote my life to art?

A. I don't think I ever decided. I always say I was born a painter. It was hard, of course, at first to figure

out how to earn a living, but I preferred to bartend three nights a week rather than teach art, so I could make enough cash to pay for a small studio and work, work, work.

Q. Your last show was at Opera Gallery, Dubai. When and where is your next exhibition?

A. I am having an important exhibition in London in the Fall of 2009 which will be closely followed by an exhibition in Hong Kong at the end of this year.
